Critical Thinking Checklist

Clarity (We must harness our ingenuity and come together to confront and overcome all the challenges we face) Ask for clarification. Can you elaborate?
Accuracy (A statement can be clear, but not accurate) Chickens are mammals! Is that true can, we verify that?
Precision (A statement can be clear and accurate but not precise) John is overweight. Can you more specific or give me details?
Relevance (A statement can be clear, accurate and precise, but not relevant to the issue.)
Depth (Statement lack depth when they fail to deal with the complexities of the issue.) Addressing drug addiction in America. That is superficial. It does not address the physiological and psychological complexities involved in dependency.
Breadth (An argument that only considers one point of view and shuns other perspectives lacks breadth)
Logic (When the combinations of thoughts are mutually supporting and make sense in combination the thinking is logical.)
